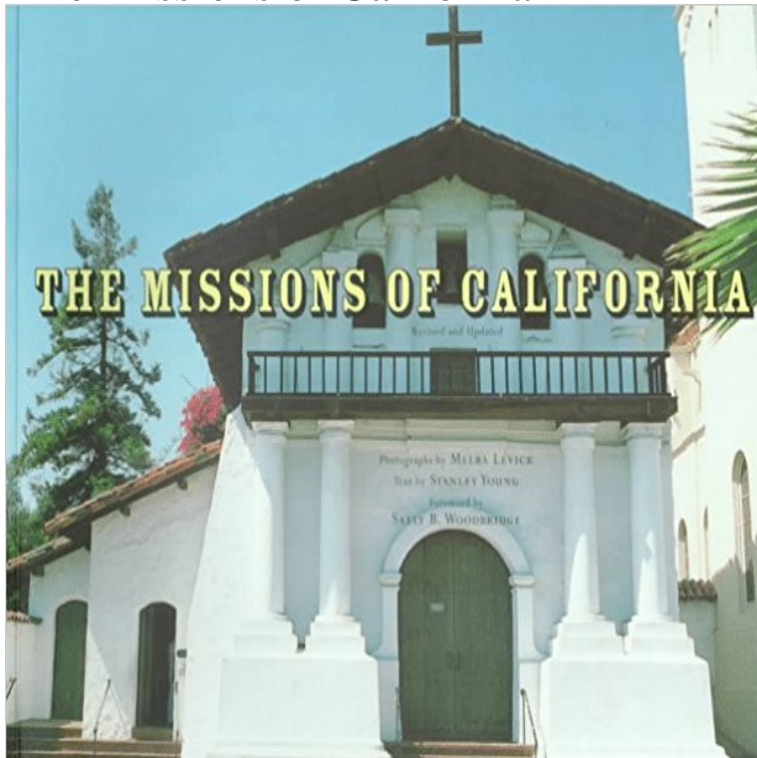


# The Missions of California
